FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...... Also Known as Chardonnay W(h)ines!

Our behalf of the parish community, I offer congratulations to all our parish graduates in the class of 2019! Whether from college and universities, high school, grammar school, kindergarten, schools of technology or professional career training, congratulations on your accomplishments and the discovery and de-

velopment of your God given talents! May you all have a bright future!!

While I was away on vacation in California May 15th – 23rd, a scripture passage came to mind several times: "When I see your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and stars that you set in place – what are humans that you are mindful of them, mere mortals, that you care for them?" (Psalm 8:4-5) Visiting Yosemite for the first time and experiencing the grandeur of El Capitan, the valleys and streams, and the powerfully flowing waterfalls (they had 180% of normal snowfall this year) and standing next to the giant Sequoias, I could only marvel at the grandness of God's creation. That scripture passage came to mind again when I visited what I call the "outdoor cathedral." There is a grove of costal redwood trees called Armstrong Woods in Guerneville. Some of these majestic redwoods are over 300 feet tall, 15 feet in diameter and 1,400 years old. It is the calmest and most still place on earth that I have ever been. It is so quiet that you can hear yourself think! And the intriguing and mysterious play of the sun light making its way through some of the trees adds to the specialness of this place. That scripture passage came to mind again when I went to the ocean at Bodega Bay, Jenner, and Fort Ross. Sitting and just being lulled into mindlessness by the rhythm of the waves one can only be refreshed and renewed. In all these places, I realized that God does have a plan. The millions and thousands of years it took for Yosemite to be carved, the redwoods and sequoias to grow, the ocean to form around the continents, God did this so that in time, we humans, mere mortals, could enjoy His creation. The beauty we see in nature today was created for US to enjoy today! "What are humans that you are mindful of them....Yet you have made them little less than a god, crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them rule over the works of your hands, put all things at their feet: All sheep and oxen, even the beast of the field, the birds of the air, the fish of the seas, and whatever swims the paths of the seas. O Lord, our God, how awesome is your name through all the earth! May we be good stewards of what we have been given rule over!

Next weekend is Pentecost Sunday, the conclusion of the Easter Season. In addition to decorations and flowers, we encourage you to be a part of the celebration by wearing some red, yellow, or orange. And finally, please keep Fr. Mark in your prayers this week as he will be away on a silent retreat at Creighton in Omaha, Nebraska, June 3rd through 7th.

¡A nombre de nuestra comunidad parroquial, doy felicitaciones a todos nuestros graduados de la parroquia en la clase del 2019! Ya sea de college y universidades, escuela secundaria, escuela primaria, jardín, escuelas de tecnología o carreras de capacitación profesional, ¡felicitaciones en sus

logros y el descubrimiento y desarrollo de sus talentos dados por Dios! ¡Que todos Uds. tengan un futuro brillante!

Mientras estaba de vacaciones en California del 15 al 23 de mayo, un pasaje de las Escrituras me vino a la mente varias veces: "Cuando veo tus cielos, el trabajo de tus dedos, la luna y las estrellas que colocas en su lugar, ¿qué son los humanos que tu estas consciente de ellos, simples mortales, que los cuidas?" (Salmo 8:4-5). Visitando Yosemite por primera vez y experimentando la grandeza de El Capitán, los valles y arroyos y las cascadas que fluyen poderosamente (tenían 180% de las nevadas normales este año) y al lado de las gigantes Sequoias, solo podía maravillarme de la grandeza de la creación de Dios. Ese pasaje de las Escrituras me vino a la mente de nuevo cuando visité lo que llamo la "catedral al aire libre". Hay una arboleda costera de árboles de madera roja llamada Armstrong Woods en Guerneville. Algunos de estos árboles majestuosas tienen más de 300 pies de altura, 15 pies de diámetro y 1,400 años. Es el lugar más tranquilo y más quieto en la tierra en el que he estado. ¡Es tan silencioso que puedes oírte pensar! Y el juego intrigante y misterioso de la luz del sol que se abre paso a través de algunos de los árboles se suma a la especialidad de este lugar. Ese pasaje de las Escrituras me vino a la mente de nuevo cuando fui al océano en Bodega Bay, Jenner y Fort Ross. Sentarse y simplemente dejarse arrullar por el ritmo de las olas, uno solo puede ser refrescado y renovado. En todos estos lugares, me di cuenta de que Dios tiene un plan. Los millones y miles de años que le tomaron a Yosemite para ser tallado, los arboles de madera roja y las seguoias para crecer, el océano para formarse alrededor de los continentes. Dios hizo esto para que con el tiempo, los humanos, simples mortales, pudiéramos disfrutar de Su creación. ¡La belleza que vemos en la naturaleza hoy fue creada para NOSOTROS y que la disfrutemos hoy! IN BETWEEN

In between: we all find ourselves there from time to time—sometimes uncomfortably. Like in between money coming in and money going out, earning income and paying bills. In between customer and manager, diner and chef: any honest server trying to serve both. In between theory and practice, ideal and reality: everyone from parents to pastors. Ask the kids—or parishioners! This Sunday, in between Ascension and Pentecost, reminds us we're in between Jesus' departure and glorious return—sometimes uncomfortably. Though Jesus promises in Revelation, "I am coming soon," Acts shows Stephen tragically called home first. But Pope Francis urges us not to become "sourpusses," as if living Gospel love is impossible in between. Today's Gospel shows Jesus praying for those about to betray, deny, and desert him, but also praying "for those who will believe in me through their word." Us! "So that they"—we—"may all be one." National Stroke Awareness Month

The month of May is designated as a time to learn what stroke is, how to prevent it, the signs of a stroke and what to do when it happens. Stroke is the fifth leading cause of death in the U.S. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention statistics show that more than 795,000 people in the U.S. have a stroke and about 140,000 Americans die from a stroke each year.

A stroke occurs when the blood supply to the brain is cut off (an ischemic stroke) or when a blood vessel bursts (a hemorrhagic stroke). The most common type is the ischemic stroke. Oxygen to the brain is disrupted causing brain cells to die. Death or permanent disability can result from a stroke.

The major signs of a stroke are sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arms or legs; sudden confusion or trouble speaking or understanding others; sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes; sudden trouble walking, dizziness, or loss of balance or coordination; and sudden severe headache with no known cause. If you think someone is having a stroke, call 9-1-1 immediately! The optimal time to get to the emergency room for treatment is within three hours of the onset of signs of a stroke.

The acronym FAST is an easy way to remember the signs of a stroke. F is for Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop? A is for Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? S is for Speech: Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Is their speech slurred? T is for Time: If you observe any of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately!!!

Be aware of the stroke risk factors such as high blood pressure, physical inactivity, high blood lipids (fats), poor diet, obesity, smoking, alcohol intake, stress and diabetes. It is important to take action concerning the risk factors that you can control in order to reduce your risk of having a stroke. Please consult with your health care professional to discuss your risk for a stroke and decide on an action plan to make healthy lifestyle choices and medical treatment as appropriate. It is never too late to make changes to improve your health!


