### From The Pastor's Desk...

#### WE'RE STEPPING OUT IN FAITH!

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples on mission telling them to take NOTHING with them. In other words, to trust in Di-

vine Providence that their needs will be taken care of. And so it is with us at Our Lady of Mercy! We trust that the needs of the parish, God will provide for through the generosity of our parishioners. Today I want to share with you a message about the financial status of our parish, as the fiscal year 2020-2021 ended on June 30, 2021. I am pleased to inform you that we did have a positive end to the fiscal year primarily for four reasons – continued generosity of our parishioners, a reduction in staff salaries, a reduction of expenses due to a lack of use of the facilities, and reception of a PPP loan, which has been forgiven.

I want to say a word of <u>profound</u> thanks to all of you who, during the pandemic were able to continue your Sunday contributions, especially through online giving. Prior to the pandemic, our average Sunday collection was \$32,000 weekly. During the pandemic and currently, our average Sunday collection is \$27,200 weekly. As I said, we were able to weather that loss in income for the reasons mentioned above.

The new fiscal year 2021-2022 just began on July  $1^{st}$ . With most Covid protocols no longer in effect and capacity restrictions lifted, we are gearing up for a return of in-person participation at Mass and our parish organizations and ministries. This will require the re-hiring of custodial services from Buck Services and daily maintenance of the building in addition to purchasing supplies for organizations and ministries. We are re-organizing our RE staff and office and are planning to hire an additional youth minister to focus especially on evangelizing our teens.

So, here is where we are stepping out in faith! To cover these expenses in our new fiscal year, our financial council has budgeted our average Sunday collection to be \$30,000 weekly – an increase of \$2,800 from where we have been during the pandemic, but still short of the \$32,000 we were averaging prior to the pandemic. It would be great to get back to that prepandemic level! But, we feel with our faith in you, we will reach our goal of \$30,000 weekly!

God bless all of you for however you can support OLM financially and with your time and talent, and with your prayers!

### ¡ESTAMOS DANDO UN PASO ADELAN-TE EN LA FE!

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús envía a sus discípulos en misión diciéndoles que no lleven NADA con ellos. En otras palabras, confiar en la Divina Providen-

cia para que sus necesidades sean atendidas. ¡Y así es con nosotros en Our Lady of Mercy! Confiamos en que Dios proveerá las necesidades de la parroquia a través de la generosidad de nuestros feligreses. Hoy quiero compartir con ustedes un mensaje sobre el estado financiero de nuestra parroquia, ya que el año fiscal 2020-2021 terminó el 30 de junio del 2021. Me complace informarles que tuvimos un final positivo para el año fiscal principalmente por cuatro razones: la continua generosidad de nuestros feligreses, una reducción en los salarios del personal, una reducción de los gastos debido a la falta de uso de las instalaciones y la recepción de un préstamo PPP, que ha sido condonado.

Quiero decir unas palabras de <u>profundo</u> agradecimiento a todos ustedes que, durante la pandemia, pudieron continuar con sus contribuciones dominicales, especialmente a través de donaciones en línea. Antes de la pandemia, nuestra recaudación dominical promedio era de \$32,000 por semana. Durante la pandemia y actualmente, nuestra recaudación dominical promedio es de \$27,200 por semana. Como dije, pudimos capear esa pérdida de ingresos por las razones mencionadas anteriormente.

El nuevo año fiscal 2021-2022 acaba de comenzar el 1º de julio. Con la mayoría de los protocolos de Covid ya no vigentes y las restricciones de capacidad eliminadas, nos estamos preparando para un regreso de la participación en persona en la Misa y en nuestras organizaciones y ministerios parroquiales. Esto requerirá la recontratación de los servicios de conserjería de Buck Services y el mantenimiento diario del edificio, además de la compra de suministros para las organizaciones y ministerios. Estamos reorganizando nuestro personal y la oficina de Educación Religiosa y estamos planeando contratar a un ministro de jóvenes adicional para enfocarnos especialmente en evangelizar a nuestros adolescentes.

¡Entonces, aquí es donde estamos dando un paso adelante en la fe! Para cubrir estos gastos en nuestro nuevo año fiscal, nuestro consejo financiero ha presupuestado nuestra recaudación dominical promedio en \$30,000 semanales, un aumento de \$2,800 con respecto a donde hemos estado durante la pandemia, pero aún por debajo de los \$32,000 que promediamos antes de la pandemia. ¡Sería genial volver a ese nivel previo a la pandemia! Pero, sentimos que con nuestra fe en ustedes, ¡alcanzaremos nuestra meta de \$30,000 por semana!

# Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I don't know about you, but even for the quickest of errands I don't like to leave my house without my smartphone. Nor would I go on a road trip without my trusty mini-Diet Coke and a snack or two. So I'm struck by what Jesus tells the Apostles when he sends them on their mission to share the Good News: "He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick - no food, no sack, no money in their belts." While it may be hard for us to imagine striking out with only the sandals on our feet, to me this reading is more about what the Apostles did have than what they went without: They had a companion (Jesus sent them two by two) and the spiritual blessings Saint Paul refers to, including a relationship with Jesus and absolute trust in him. Today's readings remind us to set aside distractions and spend time deepening our relationship with Jesus through prayer, reading the Scriptures, and participating in the sacramental life of the Church. In doing so, we, too, can join in the mission of the early disciples by giving our lives to Jesus and sharing his message with others.

### **GO** EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I find the phrase "the new evangelization" somewhat ironic. After all, evangelization is not new, it goes back to the earliest days of the Church, which wouldn't exist had it not been for the disciples. The "new" part reminds us that we today also share in this mission. The U.S. Catholic bishops describe it succinctly: "The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel." This call is both simple, and challenging, but we don't have to be perfect. After all, just as God called Amos, a humble shepherd, and Jesus called the Twelve, a motley group of fishermen, he calls us. Like them, our first "task" isn't a task at all – it is placing God and our relationship with Jesus at the center of our lives. Only then can we effectively share the Gospel with others, inviting our brothers and sisters to a life in Christ – to become part of God's adopted family.

**WITNESS** At the end of Sunday Mass, we often hear the words: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." As we are sent forth, let us ask God to show us how we can share the Gospel with others during the week ahead. Then pay attention to where the Spirit leads us in answering our prayer.

### Pastoral Care

### Be Aware of the West Nile Virus

The West Nile virus (WNV) is the leading cause of mosquito-borne disease in the U.S. The virus is spread to people by the bite of an infected mosquito. There are no vaccines to prevent or medications to treat WNV.

One in five people that are infected with the virus do not develop a fever or other symptoms. Some may develop a headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea or a rash. Fatigue and weakness can last for weeks or months. About 1 out of 150 infected people develop a serious, sometimes fatal illness that affects the central nervous system.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the best ways to prevent WNV are to use insect repellent, wear long-sleeved shirts and pants, treat clothing and gear, and take steps to control mosquitoes indoors and outdoors. Due to the recent rain, there may be places in the yard where stagnant water may be a breeding ground for mosquitoes. Take action to remove the water and lessen the population of mosquitoes. If you think that you or someone you know may have West Nile virus disease, talk with a health care provider for evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment for the symptoms.

### **Healthy Ways to Manage Stress**

So many worries and concerns in life can overload our minds and cause stress that affects our physical, emotional, mental and spiritual health. For the stress that has a negative impact on our health, the American Heart Association suggests some simple techniques to deal with that stress.

Positive self-talk helps a person to calm down and control stress. Instead of saying, "I can't do this" — change it to "I'll do the best I can" or instead of saying, "I feel helpless and alone" — "I can reach out and get help if I need it".

Use emergency stress- stoppers to defuse stress in the moment such as count to ten before you speak or react; take a few slow, deep breaths; go for a walk; say a prayer or reflect on scripture.

Participate in stress-busting activities to help you feel uplifted and filled with joy. Do an activity that you

enjoy such as art, reading, meeting a friend, playing with your kids, grand-children or pets, playing a sport, listening to music, going for a walk or going to church to pray.

# 2021-2022 Parish Family Evangelization & Catechesis Age 4 Kindergarten – Grade 5

Supporting Families on Their Journey of Faith

### **Introduction & Invitations to Family Faith Formation**

Family Faith Formation will build upon the parent-led model used this past year, while also providing a few on-site options each month to reconnect as a faith community in small and large group settings with other parents and children. Whether you select the at-home option with a virtual component, or a combination of in-person offerings, the **Pflaum Gospel weeklies** is our approved curriculum as used prior to the pandemic. We hope you find a formation option that fits the needs of your household and responds to how we as family catechists and parish leaders desire to partner with you in the mission of forming life-long disciples.

FAMILIES are provided with the *Gospel Weeklies* to share together at home. The time commitment can range from 30-60 minutes per week depending on the number and grade level(s) of children in your household. User-friendly parent guides are provided with each grade level grouping: Promise (K-1), Good News (Grades 2 & 3), Venture (Grades 4, 5 & 6). Although there are different packets for different grade levels, they all focus on the same theme/Sunday Gospel for each weekend Mass.

Families who have a student ready to prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, will use our Sacramental Preparation Family Kits. *MEND* is a seven-week family journey to encounter Jesus' mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. *NOURISH* is a ten-week family journey to discover and grow in the Lord's real presence in the celebration of the Eucharist. An initial training at the parish with parents and their children will take place prior to the reception of the family kits.

### In-Person Option #1: Gospel for ALL Ages

This option will take place the first two Wednesdays of the month, October-April. Parents and their child(ren) gather in small (10-12) multi-age groups, led by family catechists, 6:00-7:00pm. Parents take the lead at home with their children for the following two weeks of the month.

### In-Person Option #2: Mass to Mission

Families are invited to gather once-a-month on Sundays, September-April. These Family Table Gatherings are guided by family catechists who help facilitate gospel related activities. This option is highly encouraged, but not limited to families with children preparing for Sacraments. Time Options: 11am-12pm (following 10am Mass) OR 4:30-5:30pm (before 5:30pm Mass).

### Virtual Option #3: Zoom into the Gospel

Meet twice a month with a Family Catechist over zoom for a faith activity, discussion, and prayer inspired by the Pflaum Gospel Weekly or directly from it that connects everyone to the upcoming Sunday Gospel at Mass. Dates and times to be determined with your family catechist.

We expect you will have questions about our new evangelization and catechesis models of Family Faith Formation for parents and children, Age 4 Kindergarten – Grade 5. It is highly encouraged that you voice them at one of the following meetings:

(This meeting will follow the 10:00am Mass and end in time for the 12:00pm Mass.)

**Double-check the sender's email address.** A spoofed email address often has an extension similar to the legitimate email address. You can outsmart them by looking beyond the name and checking the "from" email address to see if it matches what you know the alleged sender's email to be.

Always verify in person/telephone before sending money or sensitive data. Be suspicious! Make it standard operating procedure to confirm email requests for wire transfer, debit cards, account information or confidential information.
