Mission trips for high school teens are offered at many parishes throughout our Diocese as a way for teens to put their faith in action and grow in their relationship with Jesus. Just this past July, 47 teens and

10 adult chaperones from Our Lady of Mercy went on a Catholic Heart Mission Trip to Minneapolis-St. Paul, MN doing various projects helping the poor. From what I hear, they had an amazing experience!

I had that same kind of experience in 2014 when I was pastor at St. Thomas the Apostle parish in Naperville. Myself and two other adult chaperones accompanied six teens from St. Thomas on a mission trip to Duchity in Haiti. Haiti is an extremely impoverished country, but to see it in person is soul wrenching! St. Thomas the Apostle parish has had a "twinning" relationship for 21 years with the Catholic Church in Duchity staffed by the Holy Cross Fathers. The parish operates a medical clinic and school. It was there that I met Ertha Papilion, who founded and operates an orphanage and school several miles from Duchity. When our group visited, the children were so excited and happy to see us. We toured the orphanage and school and spent hours playing with the children. The smiles and joy on their faces are etched in my memory.

In today's bulletin you will see an announcement that Ertha is coming to Our Lady of Mercy to make an appeal for her orphanage and school. I ask that you be as generous as possible in making a donation to keep her orphanage and school viable. The article shows a picture of Ertha and me. Let me share with you an picture of the children at the orphanage along with St. Thomas teens and the adult chaperones.

Los viajes de misiones para adolescentes de la secundaria se ofrecen en muchas parroquias de nuestra Diócesis como una forma para que los adolescentes pongan su fe en acción y crezcan en su relación con Jesús. En este

julio pasado, 47 adolescentes y 10 chaperones adultos de Our Lady of Mercy fueron a un Viaje de Misión del Corazón Católico a Minneapolis-St. Paul, Minnesota realizando varios proyectos para ayudar a los pobres. Por lo que escuché, ¡tuvieron una experiencia increíble!

Yo tuve ese mismo tipo de experiencia en el 2014 cuando era párroco en la parroquia de St. Thomas the Apostle en Naperville. Yo y otros dos chaperones adultos acompañamos a seis adolescentes de St. Thomas en un viaje de misión a Duchity en Haití. Haití es un país extremadamente empobrecido, ¡pero verlo en persona es desgarrador! La parroquia de St. Thomas the Apostle ha tenido una relación de "hermanamiento" durante 21 años con la Iglesia Católica en Duchity atendida por los Padres de la Santa Cruz. La parroquia opera una clínica médica y una escuela. Fue allí donde conocí a Ertha Papilion, quien fundó y opera un orfanato y una escuela a varias millas de Duchity. Cuando nuestro grupo los visitó, los niños estaban muy emocionados y felices de vernos. Recorrimos el orfanato y la escuela y pasamos horas jugando con los niños. Las sonrisas y la alegría en sus rostros están grabadas en mi memoria.

En el boletín de hoy verán un anuncio de que Ertha vendrá a Our Lady of Mercy para hacer una campaña para su orfanato y su escuela. Les pido que sean lo más generosos posible al hacer una donación para mantener viables su orfanato y su escuela. El artículo muestra una foto de Ertha y yo. Permítanme compartir con ustedes una foto de los niños en el orfanato junto con los adolescentes de St. Thomas y los chaperones adultos.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We have apps that monitor our sleep and calories, and remind us to get our steps in. Short on time? We order takeout or subscribe to a meal service. Yet, despite these modern conveniences, I would guess that most of us don't sleep enough or consistently eat well. And we pay the price, whether in the short or long term. Enter Elijah, who had reached his limit physically and mentally. Yet after an angel provided him food and drink, Elijah found the strength to walk 40 days and 40 nights. Impressive! But that's God for us! And in the provision of his Son, we have food and drink - bread from heaven - that not only sustains us for our journey on earth but offers the possibility of eternal life. This is our belief; this is what Jesus says to us. And that alone can give us strength, and hope, even when we're having an "Elijah" moment. For at each and every holy Mass, Jesus invites us to the table, offering us food that not only sustains but also transforms us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord, indeed!

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Just as a good night's sleep and proper nutrition help us function our best, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and our communal life of faith, provide the spiritual nourishment we need as we strive to be imitators of God in our daily lives, as Saint Paul says. As we partake of Christ in the Eucharist, perhaps we can say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask Jesus to help us grow in the ways of love that Paul outlined: kindness, compassion, and forgiveness toward the people we encounter. It could mean letting go of a grudge, becoming more conscious of the needs of others, listening respectfully to someone with whom we disagree, or perhaps forgiving ourselves. The Holy Spirit will guide us.

REFLECT Think about the ways the Mass transforms you. It may be something subtle – the spirit of consolation and the feeling that things are right in your world – or you may have been particularly moved by the readings, homily, music, or silent prayer. Tell someone about it!


