And at our least sign of remorse, never tires of forgiving us. Let us pray that we all may open our hearts more fully to the gift of life and dignity in each and every person! St. Joseph, defender of life, pray for us!

While the readings focus on the relationship between man and woman, we are reminded that God created all of us – no matter our state in life – to love one another as he loves us. The capacity to love is in our DNA. Jesus invites us to be companions on life's journey, reflecting to others Christ's love for the Church.
