

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



Being the only son and "baby of the family," I do have the claim to being my mom's favorite and perfect son (her words, not mine). It also doesn't hurt that I also became a priest! However, as you all know by now, I am certainly not perfect, nor completely self-sufficient. This becomes particularly clear given the fact that I too seek out the Sacrament of Reconciliation about every other month—I need Jesus just as

much as anyone else!—and given the fact that some ministerial tasks prove to be too big for me to handle on my own—I need to depend on others! But there is a beauty in not being perfect in ourselves! As St. Aelred put it, "Almighty God can complete anyone He pleases. But God desires that we depend on each other, and what anyone does not have in himself, he finds in the other. Thus, humility is preserved, love increased, and unity realized."

This quotation shows us that God has a beautiful purpose for giving us the gift of each other! Do we realize what a gift it is to need to depend on others? Or to have to ask for help sometimes? This is seen in our first reading from Acts of the Apostles as a lesson to the early Church. In this passage, there was a serious need being neglected as the Hellenist widows were being ignored. So how did the Church respond? It called forward seven new deacons, each with Greek names. The response to the problem came from within the community! "Humility is preserved, love increased, and unity realized."

What a beautiful lesson that we can learn from the early Church. If we see a legitimate need within our community, that's okay! We can trust that the Holy Spirit will call forward generous volunteers to complete the task. In fact, if God is raising that need before your eyes, perhaps He's asking you to respond to it! Let's ask the Holy Spirit this Easter season where He may be asking us to serve others within our beautiful parish of Our Lady of Mercy. That way humility is preserved, love increased, and unity realized.

Sin embargo, como ya saben, ciertamente no soy perfecto ni completamente autosuficiente. Esto se vuelve particularmente claro dado el hecho de que yo también busco el Sacramento de la Reconciliación cada dos meses. —

¡Necesito a Jesús tanto como cualquier otra persona!—y dado el hecho de que algunas tareas ministeriales resultan ser demasiado grandes para manejarlas por mí mismo —¡necesito depender de los demás! ¡Pero hay una belleza en no ser perfectos en nosotros mismos! Como dijo San Aelred, "Dios Todopoderoso puede completar a cualquiera que le plazca. Pero Dios quiere que dependamos unos de otros, y lo que uno no tiene en sí mismo, lo encuentra en el otro. Así, se preserva la humildad, se aumenta el amor y se realiza la unidad".

Qué hermosa lección que podemos aprender de la Iglesia primitiva. Si vemos una necesidad legítima dentro de nuestra comunidad, ¡está bien! Podemos confiar en que el Espíritu Santo llamará a voluntarios generosos para completar la tarea. De hecho, si Dios está planteando esa necesidad ante tus ojos, ¡tal vez te esté pidiendo que respondas a ella! Pidámosle al Espíritu Santo en esta temporada de Pascua dónde nos puede pedir que sirvamos a otros dentro de nuestra hermosa parroquia de Our Lady of Mercy. De esa manera se preserva la humildad, se aumenta el amor y se realiza la unidad.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Illinois tax credit scholarship program has proven to be a beacon of hope and a guiding force toward a better life for thousands of Illinois students and their families. However, that light may be snuffed out unless the Illinois General Assembly acts to continue the law that provides for this program. Therefore, we are writing to ask you to contact your Illinois state representative and state senator to express your desire to retain the tax credit scholarship program.

Since its inception six years ago, the tax credit scholarship program has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending private schools in the state. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a 75% tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax. All of the scholarships are need-based. Without this program, Illinois families may be unable to send their loved ones to the school of their choice. Demand for scholarships is high - for every scholarship granted, three students were turned down due to lack of funds.

Allowing the tax credit scholarship program to sunset would not only be a life altering disservice to the families it is designed to help, but would also create long-term consequences by weakening the state's educational choices and placing additional roadblocks in front of thousands of Illinois students on the path to a brighter future.

Please contact your state representative and state senator to let them know you support extending the tax credit scholarship program in Illinois law. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do so also. Our collective voice is needed. 



Hello! My name is Deacon Frank Pusateri, and I am excited to be assigned to be the new parochial vicar of Our Lady of Mercy Parish beginning July 1, 2023!

I was born in Chicago, but I grew up in Roselle and in Bloomingdale. My parents are Joe and Maria Pusateri. I also have a younger brother and a younger sister. My home parish is St. Walter Church in Roselle. I graduated from Lake Park High School in 2012, and Franciscan University of Steubenville in 2016 with a degree in English and Theology. Ever since I was seven years old, I felt a call to priesthood, and through high school and college, I alternately discerned and fought that call. But after a summer of teaching Totus Tuus with seminarians of the Diocese of Joliet in 2016, I could see myself as one of them and shortly after applied for and was accepted as a seminarian. I completed my Pre-Theology studies at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus.

For the past four years, I have been completing my Theology studies at Mundelein Seminary. For the past two years, I have been assisting at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills, and have loved serving as a deacon there for the past year, preaching, baptizing babies, and just being part of the community! I will graduate from Mundelein in May, but that is not the most exciting thing that will happen to me this month. On May 20, Bishop Hicks will ordain me a priest for the Diocese of Joliet!

Reflection

Spiritual and Religious

The question is often asked why you need religion at all. Can't you just be a spiritual person and go directly to God? Especially in the wake of scandal, doesn't it seem like all human institutions have failed in one way or another to transmit the Gospel to all people at all times?

Years ago a very popular Youtube video showed a man speaking poetry claiming that he loved Jesus but hated religion. This seems to be a modern response to the horrible tragedies that have happened in religious institutions over the course of history, and these tragedies should not ever go unnoticed or the victims of these tragedies be forgotten.

Though it may be coming from a genuine place of concern for people to say they don't need religion, it is clear from the very beginning that Jesus founded a religion, a visible Church. He knew better than anyone that people could come directly to him, but he didn't set it up that way. In today's First Reading we hear a beautiful story of the early Church organizing and ordaining more priests in order to serve the growing needs of the flock. Right from the very beginning in Acts 6 we see the need for a visible Church that can bring the visible Christ to visible people with tangible needs.

Of course we can always go directly to God, but as human beings we often get in our own way. I know many Protestant friends who ask God directly for forgiveness and then have to struggle through mental games wondering if they truly are sorry and repentant. One of the benefits to a visible Church and visible sacraments is that we don't need to guess. Even Catholics can go directly to God and make a perfect act of contrition, but we are required by Canon Law to confess our sins to a priest, not because the Church wants to assure that we feel embarrassed about our sins, but so that we can have the assurance of forgiveness.

Though the Church is not perfect because it is full of very sinful people, myself included, being spiritual and not religious constantly leaves us wondering or worried about where we stand before God. With the Sacraments we need not worry, we have the assurance of Christ.

So take hope during this Easter season that God has set up a Church, that it is a visible body with authority, and that by living in this Church we can be assured that God is working for our salvation, despite the things we do or the lies we believe. Why not have the best of both worlds? Let's make it a point this Easter season to be spiritual and also religious, clinging to the hope that Jesus brings through his death and resurrection.

Restore






