News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



From the moment I was assigned to Our Lady of Mercy, I have been overwhelmed by the warm welcome I have received from parishioners. It has been awesome to begin to feel like a part of the community of OLM before my official assignment even began. But I realize that this enthusiasm isn't about me, but about the One I represent.

As a priest, I am called not just to represent Christ, but to become Jesus, to act *in persona Christi*, so that I can say with my own mouth, "This is my Body." In the

short time I have been a priest, I have been struck by the awesome responsibility of what this means—that a weak human being like me is called to be Jesus for others. And yet, this has strengthened my faith because I know my weaknesses better than anybody, I can see more clearly that God is doing the work through me.

Not just priests, but every Christian is called to be Jesus. In the Gospel, Jesus says, "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." That's a tall order. How can we possibly become Jesus?

We can only become Jesus if we know Jesus, through speaking to Him in prayer as our closest friend and being united to Him in the sacraments, especially the Holy Eucharist. Have you ever noticed that the more time you spend with a person, the more you become like that person? The same is true of Jesus!

And yet in all of this, there will be times when we fail to image Jesus. But this isn't a reason to give up, but rather a reason for hope. In spite of our failings, God is still able to use us to be Jesus to those around us. In these moments, we can realize that it is truly God shining through us rather than our own effort. St. John Henry Newman has given us a beautiful prayer to help us grow more like Jesus every day:

Dear Jesus, help me to spread Your fragrance wherever I go. Flood my soul with Your spirit and life.

Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly, that my life may only be a radiance of Yours.

Shine through me, and be so in me that every soul I come in contact with may feel Your presence in my soul.

Let them look up and see no longer me, but only Jesus!

Stay with me and then I shall begin to shine as You shine, so to shine as to be a light to others.

The light, O Jesus, will be all from You; none of it will be mine. It will be You shining on others through me.

Let me thus praise You the way You love best, by shining on those around me.

Let me preach You without preaching, not by words but by my example, by the catching force of the sympathetic influence of what I do, the evident fullness of the love my heart bears to You.

In spite of my weakness, God has called me to be His priest, and to be His priest here at Our Lady of Mercy Parish. I look forward to being Jesus for you and also to receiving Jesus in each and every one of you.

Noticias del P.I.T. (Sacerdote en formación)



Desde el momento en que me asignaron a Our Lady of Mercy, me ha abrumado la cálida bienvenida que he recibido de los feligreses. Ha sido increíble comenzar a sentirme parte de la comunidad de OLM incluso antes de que comenzara mi asignación oficial. Pero me doy cuenta de que este entusiasmo no se trata de mí, sino de Aquel a quien represento.

Como sacerdote, estoy llamado no solo a representar a Cristo, sino a convertirme en Jesús, a actuar *in persona Christi*, para poder decir con mi propia boca: "Este es mi Cuerpo". En el poco tiempo que llevo como sacerdote, me ha llamado la atención la

tremenda responsabilidad de lo que esto significa: que un ser humano débil como yo esté llamado a ser Jesús para los demás. Y sin embargo, esto ha fortalecido mi fe porque conozco mis debilidades mejor que nadie, puedo ver más claramente que Dios está haciendo el trabajo a través de mí.

No solo los sacerdotes, sino todo Cristiano está llamado a ser Jesús. En el Evangelio, Jesús dice: "Quien los recibe a ustedes me recibe a mí; y quien me recibe a mí, recibe al que me ha enviado". Esa es una tarea difícil. ¿Cómo podemos llegar a ser Jesús?

Solo podemos convertirnos en Jesús si conocemos a Jesús, hablándole en oración como nuestro amigo más cercano y estando unidos a Él en los sacramentos, especialmente en la Sagrada Eucaristía. ¿Alguna vez has notado que cuanto más tiempo pasas con una persona, más te pareces a esa persona? ¡Lo mismo es cierto de Jesús!

Y, sin embargo, en todo esto, habrá momentos en los que fallaremos en representar a Jesús. Pero esta no es una razón para rendirse, sino más bien una razón para la esperanza. A pesar de nuestras fallas, Dios aún puede usarnos para ser Jesús para quienes nos rodean. En estos momentos, podemos darnos cuenta de que verdaderamente es Dios brillando a través de nosotros en lugar de nuestro propio esfuerzo. San John Henry Newman nos ha dado una hermosa oración para ayudarnos a crecer más como Jesús todos los días:

Jesús mío: ayúdame a esparcir Tu fragancia donde quiera que vaya; inunda mi alma con Tu espíritu y vida; llena todo mi ser y toma de él posesión de tal manera que mi vida no sea en adelante sino una irradiación de la Tuya. Quédate en mi corazón en una unión tan íntima que quienes tengan contacto conmigo puedan sentir en mí tu presencia; y que al mirarme olviden que yo existo y no piensen sino en Ti. Quédate conmigo. Así podré convertirme en luz para los otros. Esa luz, oh Jesús, vendrá toda de Ti; ni uno solo de sus rayos será mío. Te serviré apenas de instrumento para que Tú ilumines a las almas a través de mí. Déjame alabarte en la forma que te es más agradable: llevando mi lámpara encendida para disipar las sombras en el camino de otras almas. Déjame predicar Tu nombre sin palabras... Con mi ejemplo, con mi fuerza de atracción con la sobrenatural influencia de mis obras, con la fuerza evidente del amor que mi corazón siente por Ti.

A pesar de mi debilidad, Dios me ha llamado a ser Su sacerdote, y ser Su sacerdote aquí en la Parroquia de Our Lady of Mercy. Espero ser Jesús para ustedes y también recibir a Jesús en todos y cada uno de ustedes.

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kgs 4: 8-11, 14-16a | Rom 6: 3-4, 8-11 | Mt 10:37-42

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's first reading, the Shunammite woman recognized that Elisha was "a holy man of God." She and her husband then went on to provide Elisha with hospitality and lodging, and she was rewarded with a son. But how did she recognize Elisha as the holy prophet that he was? Recognition, or lack of it, is a recurrent theme in Scripture - from Mary Magdalene not recognizing the risen Lord at the tomb to the disciples not recognizing Jesus on the road to Emmaus. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus himself encouraged his listeners to learn to recognize "false prophets" because they bear bad fruit. What do we need to open our eyes to and recognize today? Perhaps the realization that Jesus' life and teachings always point us to life - life with him and in him, on earth and for eternity. As members of the body of Christ, let us ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with his love so that we may bear good fruit and always choose the road that leads to that life.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." Perhaps we should consider these words from Jesus in today's Gospel a challenge. Yes, we know that faithful discipleship comes with demands. But "losing our life"? I like to think of it as going "all in" in our response to Jesus. Investing the most we can in our relationship with Jesus means recognizing that he is the way and the truth and the life. And then we must act upon that. How? Put God first in your life. Serve him before all else. Let our relationship with Christ be like the frame that holds a building up – let it define us, strengthen us, and shape us. And may it allow us to recognize his loving presence in each moment of our lives.

ACTION The summer months are hot in the northern hemisphere, and traveling, running errands, and doing things for one-self can be difficult for those who are adversely affected by the heat. Take a look around you - at your neighbors or even those who are part of your daily circle of encounters - and be intentional at recognizing who they are (a child of God) and what their needs might be. Offer specific assistance to them related to that need, as the Shunammite woman and her husband did for Elisha.


For the Budget Year 2022/23 we have Increased the Parish Sunday goal by 2%, to \$30,600/week, to help expand our various Ministries.


