

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



Did you know that in St. Matthew's Gospel the word "kingdom" is used 50 times? This includes the 28 times that he mentions the "Kingdom of Heaven". Maybe St. Matthew wanted us to know not only about the Kingdom of Heaven, but also about our King! In our Gospel this weekend, we hear several parables of the Kingdom of Heaven, which leads me to the following reflection.

When we talk about Heaven, we can have a tendency to only point to the future. We are not in Heaven, so it is tempting to either wait for the time when the Lord calls us there or keep it out of sight and mind. We fail to see what is being offered to us in the Gospel today, namely the reality that the Kingdom of Heaven is also here and now.

Through his parables, Jesus reveals that the Kingdom of Heaven is not something we are waiting for, but something we are called to live in right now. He explains the parable of the weeds in the field by saying, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the Kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels." We are called to respond to his Word and live as children of the Kingdom of God here on earth. Salvation begins now, not when we get to Heaven. Jesus desires to give us fullness of life in our daily lives as we await Heaven with hope. Even in the face of temptation and hardship, we are called to bear fruit in our lives and to bring others to experience this same joy.

A few chapters later in Matthew's Gospel, spoiler alert, Jesus will hand the Keys to the Kingdom of Heaven to Simon Peter, who is appointed as the rock and foundation of the Church. The Church is an integral part of the Kingdom of Heaven and provides us with graces and sacraments that give us much needed strength to follow Jesus. The Church had humble beginnings, much like the mustard seed in the parables, and yet it is now a place of refuge for all to find shelter.

Let us not ignore the Kingdom of Heaven, believing that it is something we will only experience in eternity, but instead respond to the Lord's invitation to live fully with him in the present moment. May we experience the Kingdom of Heaven here and now at Our Lady of Mercy.

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



¿Sabías que en el Evangelio de San Mateo la palabra "reino" se usa 50 veces? Esto incluye las 28 veces que menciona el "Reino de los Cielos". ¡Tal vez San Mateo guería que supiéramos no solo sobre el Reino de los Cielos, sino también sobre nuestro Rey! En nuestro Evangelio de este fin de semana, escuchamos varias parábolas del Reino de los Cielos, lo que me lleva a la siguiente reflexión.

Cuando hablamos del Cielo, podemos tener una tendencia a señalar solo el futuro. No estamos en el Cielo, por lo que es tentador esperar el momento en que el Señor nos llame allí o mantenerlo fuera de la vista y la mente. No vemos lo que se nos ofrece en el Evangelio de hoy, es decir, la realidad de que el Reino de los Cielos también está aquí y ahora.

A través de sus parábolas, Jesús revela que el Reino de los Cielos no es algo que estamos esperando, sino algo en lo que estamos llamados a vivir ahora mismo. Él explica la parábola de la cizaña en el campo diciendo: "El que siembra buena semilla es el Hijo del Hombre, el campo es el mundo, la buena semilla son los hijos del Reino. La cizaña son los hijos del maligno, y el enemigo que la siembra es el diablo. La cosecha es el fin del mundo, y los segadores son los ángeles". Estamos llamados a responder a su Palabra y a vivir como hijos del Reino de Dios aquí en la tierra. La salvación comienza ahora, no cuando lleguemos al Cielo. Jesús desea darnos plenitud de vida en nuestra vida diaria mientras esperamos el Cielo con esperanza. Incluso frente a la tentación y la dificultad, estamos llamados a dar fruto en nuestra vida y llevar a otros a experimentar esta misma alegría.

Unos capítulos más adelante en el Evangelio de Mateo, alerta de revelar demasiado, Jesús entregará las Llaves del Reino de los Cielos a Simón Pedro, quien es designado como la roca y cimiento de la Iglesia. La Iglesia es una parte integral del Reino de los Cielos y nos proporciona gracias y sacramentos que nos dan la fuerza que tanto necesitamos para seguir a Jesús. La Iglesia tuvo un comienzo humilde, muy parecido a la semilla de mostaza en las parábolas, y sin embargo, ahora es un lugar de refugio para que todos encuentren resguardo.

No ignoremos el Reino de los Cielos, creyendo que es algo que solo experimentaremos en la eternidad, sino que respondamos a la invitación del Señor de vivir plenamente con él en el momento presente. Que experimentemos el Reino de los Cielos aquí y ahora en Our Lady of Mercy.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


The parables were always my favorite Gospel readings when I was growing up. One we just heard, regarding the wheat and the weeds, was particularly comforting to me as a child. It was simple to understand, I thought: Those of us in God's Church were obviously the wheat and, of course, destined for salvation. We just needed to endure living among "the weeds" while we are in this world. As an adult, however, I realize that Jesus' message is much more challenging - much more convicting regarding my own failures and sins: I could be a weed! And while I certainly don't like that thought, I also don't like considering that anyone would be thrown into the "fiery furnace." After all, we are supposed to love one another and desire that they become part of the body of Christ and have eternal life. The reality of this world, however, is that temptation and sin surround us. Fortunately, Jesus gives us himself as the Bread of Life in the Eucharist, and we have the gift of mercy in the sacrament of reconciliation. These sacraments, as well as prayer, give us the "nutrients" we need to ensure that we remain the wheat God has sown in his field, and that we can help others be that too.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

While the sacraments can fortify our faith, what about our neighbors, friends or family who are not Catholic or who have fallen away from the Church? This is where evangelization comes in - inviting someone to join you at Mass or suggesting a religious book they might enjoy reading. If you don't think such a simple act could make much difference in the life of another, take heart in the parables contained in the long form of today's Gospel. In those, Jesus reminds us that it doesn't take much to spread the Good News of the kingdom of heaven. The smallest of seeds can turn into the largest of plants and a small amount of yeast can leaven much flour. And if we have moments where we lack courage or feel in need of assistance, St. Paul reminds us that "the Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness." Never underestimate the power of the Advocate: he can help us pray, can intercede for us, and provide what we need to be good seed in the world.

PRAY Let us pray this week for the strength to live out our baptismal promise to reject evil, and to gain courage so as to be a witness to God, and to work toward building his kingdom on earth wherever and whenever we can.


Women Volunteers Needed


