

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



"I got you!"... I know that it's probably not the most grammatically correct saying out there. It might be better to say, "I have your back." Nonetheless, these are the words that come to my mind as I reflect on the Transfiguration of Jesus in today's Gospel: "I got you!"

The Transfiguration is the point where Jesus reveals to Peter, James, and John his divine nature, but also his kingly status. This harkens back to the first reading from the Prophet Daniel: "The one like a Son of man received dominion, glory, and kingship; all peoples, nations, and languages serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away, his kingship shall not be destroyed" (Daniel 7:13-14). A king, especially in the Old Testament, was made king because he would protect his people. As we also heard proclaimed in the psalm, "the Lord is King"! The Lord is going to do everything in his power to protect us.

Peter, James, and John see Jesus "transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light" (Mt. 17:2). Later, "a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him'" (Mt. 17:5). With this glimpse of his divine and kingly nature, the disciples are given strength to endure not only the crucifixion, but also are given strength for their future ministries. The Lord is King and has already won the battle.

As we celebrate the Transfiguration, know that Jesus desires for us to have the same personal encounter with him that his apostles experienced in the Gospel. That way, whatever crosses may come, we will know in a profound way that Jesus Christ is King and is willing to fight and die for us!

After the Transfiguration, Jesus walks down the mountain with Peter, James, and John and tells them to "not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead" (Mt.17:9). Ultimately, the Transfiguration reveals the Lord's divine plan and his desire for us to join him in the coming resurrection as well. When things get difficult, I just keep hearing Jesus Christ saying in response, "I got you!"

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



"¡Te tengo!"... Sé que probablemente no sea el dicho más gramaticalmente correcto que existe. Sería mejor decir: "Te protejo". Sin embargo, estas son las palabras que me vienen a la mente cuando reflexiono sobre la Transfiguración de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy: "¡Te tengo!"

La Transfiguración es el punto en el que Jesús revela a Pedro, Santiago y Juan su naturaleza divina, pero también su condición de rey. Esto se remonta a la primera lectura del profeta Daniel: "El que era como un Hijo de hombre recibió el dominio, la gloria y la realeza; todos los pueblos, naciones y lenguas le sirven. Su dominio es un dominio eterno que nunca será quitado, su realeza no será destruida" (Daniel 7:13-14). Un rey, especialmente en el Antiguo Testamento, fue hecho rey porque protegería a su pueblo. ¡Como también escuchamos proclamado en el salmo, "el Señor es Rey"! El Señor va a hacer todo lo que esté a su alcance para protegernos.

Pedro, Santiago y Juan ven a Jesús "transfigurado delante de ellos; su rostro resplandeció como el sol y sus vestidos se volvieron blancos como la luz" (Mt. 17:2). Después, "una nube luminosa los cubrió con su sombra, y una voz que salía de la nube decía: 'Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien me he complacido; escúchenlo'" (Mt. 17:5). Con esta vislumbre de su naturaleza divina y real, los discípulos reciben fortaleza no solo para soportar la crucifixión, sino también para sus ministerios futuros. El Señor es Rey y ya ganó la batalla.

Mientras celebramos la Transfiguración, sepan que Jesús desea que tengamos el mismo encuentro personal con él que sus apóstoles experimentaron en el Evangelio. De esa manera, cualesquiera que sean las cruces que vengan, isabremos de manera profunda que Jesucristo es Rey y está dispuesto a luchar y morir por nosotros!

Después de la Transfiguración, Jesús baja de la montaña con Pedro, Santiago y Juan y les dice que "no cuenten la visión a nadie hasta que el Hijo del Hombre haya resucitado de entre los muertos" (Mt. 17:9). En última instancia, la Transfiguración revela el plan divino del Señor y su deseo de que nos unamos a él también en la próxima resurrección. Cuando las cosas se ponen difíciles, sigo escuchando a Jesucristo decir en respuesta: "¡Te tengo!".

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

Dn 7:9-10, 13-14 | 2 Pt 1:16-19 | Mt 17:1-9

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

According to the dictionary definition, to be transfigured is to "transform into something more beautiful or elevated." This is what we see happening in Matthew's Gospel today: Jesus takes his closest disciples up the mountain and there he is transformed – he is transfigured – before them: "His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." He is also joined by Moses and Elijah as a sign that he is the fulfillment of God's promises of old. Jesus completes the old covenant that God made with his people and brings us the new covenant of salvation. The Transfiguration parallels the Baptism of the Lord in that we once again hear God speaking from the heavens to say, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." But during the Transfiguration, God adds the words, "Listen to him." That's a command not just for his disciples there on the mountain but for us today as well.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In elementary school, we were often reminded to listen. I remember one teacher who made a point to impress upon our class that listening is different from hearing. It is easy to hear, but to listen, you need to take the time to understand what is being said. In his letter today, Peter is urging us to listen to the prophetic message of Jesus. He says, "You will do well to be attentive to it" and then compares doing so to being "a lamp shining in a dark place." The world today can be a very dark place, but we don't have to be content to live in the shadows. By following Jesus' example and commands, we can bring light – along with hope and joy – to our corner of the world. Sometimes that takes courage, though. It might involve making uncomfortable or unpopular choices, but Peter promises that the "day will dawn." When that happens, we will undoubtedly see the fruits of our good works in our efforts to build God's kingdom.

PRAY This week, let us pray in both words and actions as Jesus taught us. If the Lord's Prayer is not already part of your daily prayer routine, try incorporating it this week. Then, look for ways to follow in the footsteps of Jesus by reaching out to someone who may appreciate a phone call or a visit.




