

# News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



I remember when I was 12 years old, my dad turned 50 and my oldest sister decided to follow a rule that I believe she created: namely that every 50-year-old man needs a dog! Even though it was a gift for my dad, I had wanted a dog for a long time so you can imagine my joyful reaction. We named her Tippy, and she was a wonderful dog.

It didn't take me and the rest of the family too long to find out that the dog was a wonderful scapegoat. I'm sure you have heard the line, "the dog ate my homework." Well for me it was perfect. Tippy made all the dishes dirty, Tippy made the room messy, and Tippy somehow left the toilet seat up! Tippy, as a joke, gave way for me to run away from any responsibility for my actions, and remove any need I had for correction.

This idea of running away from responsibility and correction isn't new. This blame game isn't new, and in fact we see this in the story of Adam and Eve after the Fall. Eve blames the serpent, and Adam blames God!

What is the Lord asking of us? Our Sunday readings point to the need for and importance of fraternal correction: "Jesus said to his disciples, 'If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother'" (Mt 18:15). We need to be willing to correct each other out of love. The Gospel gives us concrete steps by starting fraternal correction in private, then bringing it up with another person, and if that doesn't work finally bringing it to the Church.

To give fraternal correction is hard, especially with the conflict that it brings to light. So where do we start? How do we grow in one of the most important aspects of our faith? I believe that we need to first begin by being open to correction ourselves. Let's not jump to excuses and blame but accept in humility that we are not perfect, and that we need to change to grow closer to Christ and one another! Once we realize our own brokenness and need for correction, we are more likely to help our brothers and sistersnot out of judgment, but out of understanding and mercy in order to draw them to the Lord. (And if that's too hard, I guess you can always just get a dog!)

# Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Recuerdo que cuando yo tenía 12 años, mi papá cumplió 50 años y mi hermana mayor decidió seguir una regla que considero que ella creó: ¡que todo hombre de 50 años necesita un perro! Aunque era un regalo para mi papá, hacía mucho tiempo que yo quería un perro, así que pueden imaginar mi reacción de alegría. La llamamos Tippy y era una perra maravillosa.


No nos llevó mucho tiempo a mí y al resto de la familia descubrir que el perro era un maravilloso chivo expiatorio (a quien culpar). Estoy seguro de que han escuchado la frase "el perro se comió mi tarea". Bueno, para mí fue perfecto. Tippy ensució todos los platos, Tippy desordenó la habitación y ¡Tippy de alguna manera dejó la tapa del inodoro levantada! Tippy, a modo de broma, me dio paso para huir de cualquier responsabilidad por mis actos, y eliminar cualquier necesidad de corrección que tuviera.

Esta idea de huir de la responsabilidad y la corrección no es nueva. Este juego de culpas no es nuevo y, de hecho, lo vemos en la historia de Adán y Eva después de la Caída. ¡Eva culpa a la serpiente y Adán culpa a Dios!

¿Qué nos pide el Señor? Nuestras lecturas dominicales señalan la necesidad y la importancia de la corrección fraterna: "Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: Si tu hermano peca contra ti, ve y amonéstalo estando tú y él a solas. Si te escucha, habrás salvado a tu hermano" (Mateo 18,15). Necesitamos estar dispuestos a corregirnos unos a otros por amor. El Evangelio nos da pasos concretos al iniciar la corrección fraterna en privado, luego comentarla con otra persona y, si eso no funciona, finalmente llevarla a la Iglesia.

Dar corrección fraterna es difícil, especialmente con el conflicto que se saca a la luz. Así que ¿por dónde empezamos? ¿Cómo crecemos en uno de los aspectos más importantes de nuestra fe? Creo que primero debemos comenzar por estar abiertos a la corrección. ¡No busquemos excusas y culpa, sino aceptemos con humildad que no somos perfectos y que necesitamos cambiar para acercarnos más a Cristo y a los demás! Una vez que nos damos cuenta de nuestro propio quebrantamiento y necesidad de corrección, es más probable que ayudemos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas, no por juicio, sino por comprensión y misericordia para atraerlos al Señor. (Y si eso es demasiado difícil, ¡supongo que siempre podemos conseguir un perro!).


