

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



When I was in college, I remember going to a Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) conference with over 400 college students. I was then introduced to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, which was ongoing throughout the conference. The room was silent, and people were kneeling and praying with Jesus. I went in, sat there for 5 minutes, but then I had to leave. It was mainly because I was drawn to all the interactions hap-

pening outside of the quiet room, and I was completely unaware of the invitation from the Lord to remain with him. Little did I know that even though I couldn't spend more than 5 minutes that day in silence, the Lord would continue to draw me to him in silent Adoration throughout my own life.

As I became a FOCUS missionary and served 6 years on 3 different campuses, I learned how to, and was encouraged to pray in silent Adoration. Each missionary was required to pray a Holy Hour every day, and was also encouraged to recite a daily rosary, read and study the Bible (as you would lead Scripture Studies), seek out spiritual direction, and frequent the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Perhaps you can see why I stress those things now as a priest, because they changed my life!

Our first reading today is beautiful and almost dumbfounding at the same time when you consider Samuel's story. Samuel's mother, Hannah was barren. She prayed profusely to have a child. The Lord heard her prayer, and Eli the priest revealed to Hannah that she would have a child despite her circumstances. Samuel was born, and when the child was old enough, Hannah gave her son back to the Lord by leaving Samuel under the guidance of Eli at the Temple.

Samuel is being trained in the temple to be a priest like Eli. One night while sleeping, he hears a voice, and mistakes it as Eli's. Yet, the voice was the Lord's. Why is this dumbfounding? If anyone in the world would be able to distinguish the Lord's voice, you would hope it would be the one in the Temple training to be a priest?! And yet, perhaps Samuel himself needed more time in silence to know and hear the Lord better.

As I reflect on my time as a FOCUS missionary, I am grateful for the gift I received through their amazing missionary program. It was through this mission that I learned to pray and hear the voice of the Lord. This allowed me to ultimately respond to the Lord's calling to become a priest, and I owe my vocation to FOCUS.

If I can encourage two things it would be to first, please support this missionary program either nationally, or by supporting our own FOCUS missionary from the parish - Lucero Manzanares at <u>https://focus.org/missionaries/lucero-manzanares/</u>Secondly, like myself, I had to learn how to hear the word of the Lord through silent Adoration and prayer. May I encourage you to consider signing up for an Adoration hour once a week in our new chapel starting Feb 11th? Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Cuando estaba en la universidad, recuerdo haber asistido a una conferencia de Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) con más de 400 estudiantes universitarios. Luego me presentaron la Adoración del Santísimo Sacramento, que se desarrolló durante toda la conferencia. La sala estaba en silencio y la gente estaba arrodillada y orando con Jesús. Entré, me senté allí durante 5 minutos, pero luego tuve que irme. Fue principalmente porque me atraían todas las interacciones que ocurrían fuera de la habitación silenciosa y

desconocía por completo la invitación del Señor a permanecer con él. No sabía que, aunque no podía pasar más de 5 minutos ese día en silencio, el Señor continuaría atrayéndome hacia Él en Adoración silenciosa a lo largo de mi propia vida.

Cuando me convertí en misionero de FOCUS y serví durante 6 años en 3 campus diferentes, aprendí y me animaron a orar en Adoración silenciosa. Se requería que cada misionero orara una Hora Santa todos los días y también se le animaba a recitar un rosario diario, leer y estudiar la Biblia (como lo haría con los estudios de las Escrituras), buscar dirección espiritual y frecuentar el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Quizás puedas ver por qué hago hincapié en esas cosas ahora como sacerdote, iporque cambiaron mi vida!

Nuestra primera lectura de hoy es hermosa y casi asombrosa al mismo tiempo si consideramos la historia de Samuel. La madre de Samuel, Ana, era estéril. Ella oró profusamente para tener un hijo. El Señor escuchó su oración y el sacerdote Elí le reveló a Ana que tendría un hijo a pesar de sus circunstancias. Samuel nació, y cuando el niño tuvo edad suficiente, Ana devolvió a su hijo al Señor dejando a Samuel bajo la guía de Elí en el Templo.

Samuel está siendo entrenado en el templo para ser sacerdote como Elí. Una noche, mientras duerme, escucha una voz y la confunde con la de Eli. Sin embargo, la voz era la del Señor. ¿Por qué es esto asombroso? Si alguien en el mundo fuera capaz de distinguir la voz del Señor, ¿esperarías que fuera el que está en el Templo entrenándose para ser sacerdote? Y, sin embargo, quizás el propio Samuel necesitaba más tiempo en silencio para conocer y escuchar mejor al Señor.

Al reflexionar sobre mi tiempo como misionero de FOCUS, estoy agradecido por el regalo que recibí a través de su increíble programa misionero. Fue a través de esta misión que aprendí a orar y escuchar la voz del Señor. Esto me permitió finalmente responder al llamado del Señor de ser sacerdote, y debo mi vocación a FOCUS.

Si puedo alentar dos cosas, sería primero, apoyar este programa misionero ya sea a nivel nacional o apoyando a nuestra propia misionera FOCUS de la parroquia: Lucero Manzanares en https://focus.org/missionaries/luceromanzanares/. En segundo lugar, al igual que yo, tuve que aprender a escuchar la palabra del Señor a través de la Adoración silenciosa y la oración. ¿Puedo animarte a que consideres inscribirte en una hora de Adoración una vez por semana en nuestra nueva capilla que comienza el 11 de febrero? Puedes inscribirte por una hora con un amigo o familiar, para que puedan alternar u orar juntos: https://bit.ly/adoreJesusatOLM.

1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19 | 1 Cor 6:13c-15a, 17-20 | Jn 1:35-42

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

When Samuel hears the Lord speak in today's first reading, he mistakes it as Eli calling out to him in the temple. The third time Samuel asks if he called, Eli is wise enough to realize what is going on and guides Samuel: "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel required guidance because he "was not familiar with the Lord, because the Lord had not revealed anything to him as yet." In a similar way does the Apostle Andrew come to the Lord. In today's Gospel, Andrew didn't know who Jesus was until John the Baptist told him: "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew then began to follow Jesus, and to bring others to him. There may be times when we, like both of these men, need someone else to help us hear the call of the Lord clearly, or see his presence among us. Those who serve the Lord in this way are a great gift to us, and enable us to be that gift for others. Pray for the grace to hear what we need to hear, to see what we need to see, and to say to others, "come, we have found the Messiah."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Despite our best efforts, the time and attention we give to our lives of faith can ebb and flow. Sometimes we can feel so connected with God that we sense his presence everywhere. But there may also be times when God feels distant and we struggle to hear his voice. Notice in today's readings how Samuel "was not familiar with the Lord" but was sleeping in the temple, close to the ark; notice how Andrew was hanging around John the Baptist and immediately followed Christ when told who he was. We can see that, already before "knowing," is a "desire to know." The Lord created us, formed us into being, and calls us to a relationship with him. We are drawn to him even before we can see or know what he has revealed to us. He is our source, and our ultimate end. We seek eternal life with Christ and a path of holiness to help us on our way. The stories of Samuel and the disciple Andrew impress upon us that God is always near and calling to us - we simply must give him the opportunity to speak, sometimes when we least expect it.

INVITATION We are all called to a life of holiness. But it's not always easy to grow in holiness and strengthen one's relationship with God on our own. Consider reaching out to your parish and asking about spiritual direction – a spiritual director will help you fine tune your ears to be more attentive to the Lord's voice.

JUSTICE & PEACE UPDATE

The Justice & Peace Ministry continues to collect items and assemble Blessing Bags for homeless persons. We are in need of warm socks, wash cloths, disposable razors and granola bars. If you wish to donate any items there is a crate in the PLC lobby. We always welcome hotel size shampoo, conditioner, body lotion, bath gel and soap, toothbrushes (single wrapped) and small travel size toothpaste. We will be assembling bags in the next few weeks. Thank you all who have helped provide over 125 bags this past month.

The Christmas story continues in Matthew's gospel, after the birth of Jesus, with the arrival of the Magi who brings gifts to the newborn Christ-child and then the flight to Egypt after Joseph was warned that Herod ordered the death of all newborn male babies in a plot to kill Jesus. Eventually the Holy Family returned to their hometown. Today many families flee their homes because of persecution, unsafe conditions, lack of work to provide for their children, etc. How difficult it must have been for the Holy Family. How difficult for refugee families being resettled in a new country who arrive with little besides some clothing. Exodus World Services works with refugee families to help them become acclimated to their new surroundings, provide English classes and services to help find jobs, get children registered in school, and prepare them for citizenship, etc. They welcome church communities to partner with them and provide welcome packs - household items to set up an apartment - and food packs to provide staples for cooking meals. We can help provide these necessary items for a newly arrived family. This past year we helped three families. Exodus World has been assisting more families recently and expecting more in the coming weeks. If you would like to participate check out the items that are needed on the signup list.
