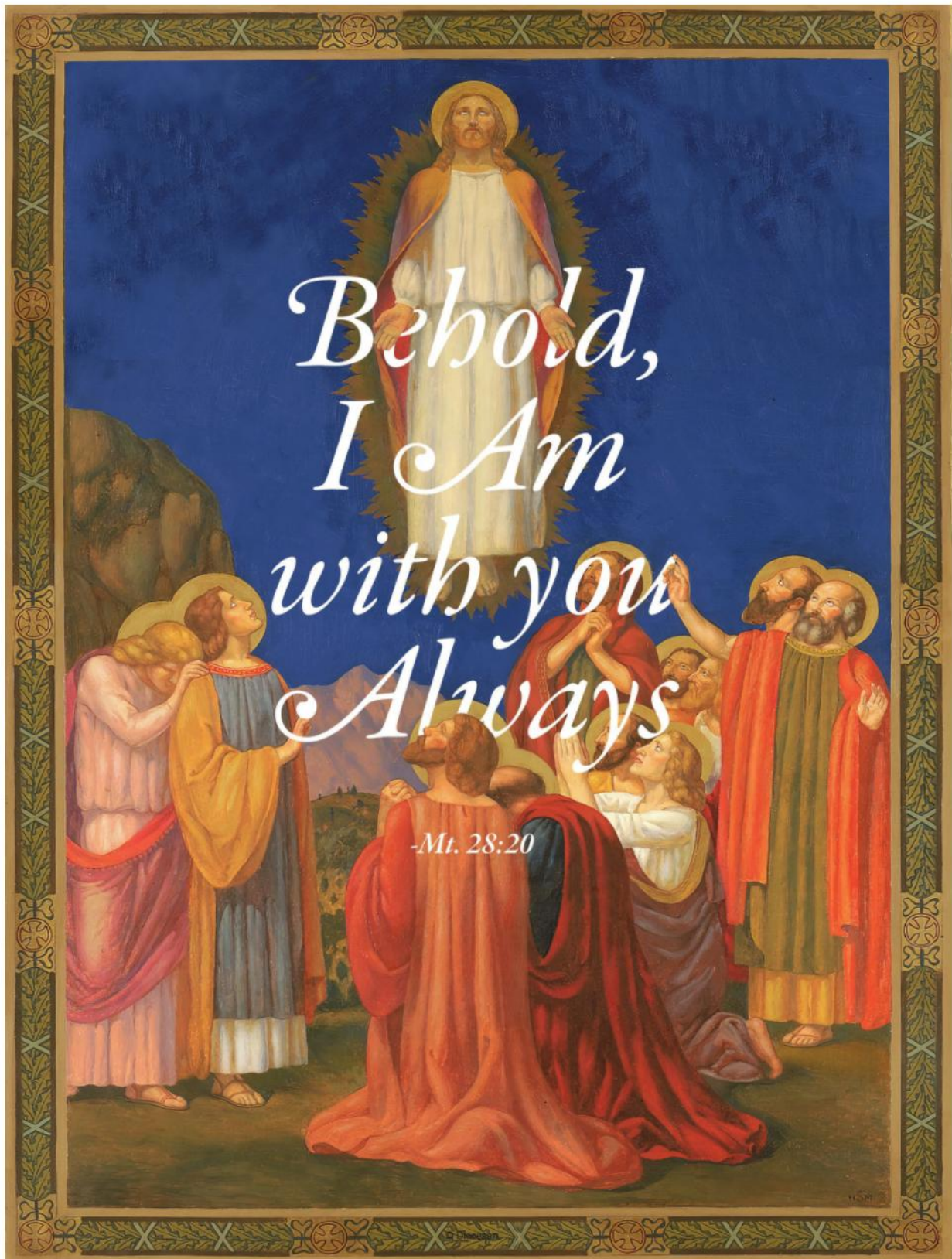

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



I've known a lot of foolish people in my life; in particular, I've known many foolish women. I should probably rephrase that. I've known many women who have loved greatly. Have you ever noticed that from the outside looking in, those who love seem to act foolishly? We see an example of this in our faith, as the Apostles left everything behind because of their love for the Lord.

And we also see this "foolishness" in our daily lives. In my own vocation, I've had people ask me about choosing the celibate life of a priest, only seeing it as something that is foolish. Of course, my response is that it is not foolishness, but really a response to love, for the sake of the Lord and his people, and only possible with God's grace to respond to the call.

As we celebrate mother's day, and a month dedicated to our Blessed Mother, I thought I would honor the "foolish" women in my life who loved radically. To my Grandmother, who allowed her husband to move to the United States to work for two years before reuniting with their 4 children. To my mother, who was engaged to another man, called off the wedding the night before, only to accept my Dad's proposal three weeks later. To my sister, who after being firmly established in her practice and field, found a man online, picked up her life, and moved across the country to follow her heart and started a family of her own. From the outside looking in, these actions may seem foolish, but if you know their stories, you can see how greatly these women loved!

I've also been lucky to know friends who have left everything to join religious communities: from my friend Sister Joshua Marie, who left Notre Dame her sophomore year (a sin to the Irish I'm sure) to pursue a life with the Missionaries of Charity (St. Mother Theresa's order), to my friend Mother Marie Benedicta of the Cross, who after college decided to join the Carmelites in the Des Plaines cloister. (Meaning that she is never able to leave and is called to live a life of continual prayer) I look up to these women, and am grateful for their example of how to love.

As we crown our Blessed Mother this weekend and celebrate Mother's Day, I think it is only fitting to honor those who have loved so greatly, that to the world it seems foolish. May we be inspired by their "foolish" acts of love. May our Blessed Mother continue to bless us, guide us, and encourage us as we respond to her son, our Lord Jesus' Christ and his beautiful call to bring the faith to all we meet. In the eyes of the world, our actions will look foolish but we know that it is all worth it because we are in love.

He conocido a mucha gente tonta en mi vida; en particular, he conocido a muchas mujeres tontas. Probablemente debería reformular eso. He conocido muchas mujeres que han amado mucho.

¿Alguna vez has notado que, desde fuera, los que aman parecen actuar tontamente? Un ejemplo de esto lo vemos en nuestra fe, ya que los Apóstoles dejaron todo atrás por amor al Señor. Y también vemos esta “tontería” en nuestra vida diaria. En mi propia vocación, algunas personas me han preguntado acerca de elegir la vida célibe de un sacerdote, viéndolo sólo como algo tonto. Por supuesto, mi respuesta es que no es una tontería, sino realmente una respuesta al amor, por la causa del Señor y de su pueblo, y sólo es posible con la gracia de Dios responder al llamado.

Mientras celebramos el día de la madre y un mes dedicado a nuestra Santísima Madre, pensé en honrar a las mujeres “tontas” de mi vida que amaron radicalmente. A mi abuela, quien permitió que su esposo se mudara a los Estados Unidos para trabajar durante dos años antes de reunirse con sus 4 hijos. A mi madre, que estaba comprometida con otro hombre, canceló la boda la noche anterior, sólo para aceptar la propuesta de mi papá tres semanas después. A mi hermana, quien después de estar firmemente establecida en su práctica y campo, encontró un hombre en línea, retomó su vida y se mudó al otro lado del país para seguir su corazón y formar su propia familia. Desde fuera, estas acciones pueden parecer tontas, pero si conoces sus historias, ¡podrás ver cuánto amaban estas mujeres!

También he sido afortunado de conocer amigas que han dejado todo para unirse a comunidades religiosas: desde mi amiga la hermana Joshua Marie, que dejó la universidad de Notre Dame en su segundo año (un pecado para los irlandeses, estoy seguro) para seguir una vida con las Misioneras de la Caridad (orden de la Santa Madre Teresa), a mi amiga la Madre Marie Benedicta de la Cruz, quien después de la universidad decidió unirse a las Carmelitas en el claustro de Des Plaines. (Lo que significa que ella nunca podrá salir y está llamada a vivir una vida de oración continua). Admiro a estas mujeres y estoy agradecido por su ejemplo de cómo amar.

Al coronar a nuestra Santísima Madre este fin de semana y celebrar el Día de la Madre, creo que es apropiado honrar a aquellas que nos han amado tanto, que al mundo le parece una tontería. Que nos inspiren sus actos “tontos” de amor. Que nuestra Santísima Madre continúe bendiciéndonos, guiándonos y animándonos mientras respondemos a su hijo, nuestro Señor Jesucristo y su hermoso llamado a llevar la fe a todos los que conocemos. A los ojos del mundo, nuestras acciones parecerán tontas, pero sabemos que todo vale la pena porque estamos enamorados.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It's easy for me to get impatient with the Lord - to wonder why he makes me wait for an answer to a prayer or, worse, why his answer may be no. However, when I look back at the lessons of the Bible, it becomes clear that God works on his timetable, not mine. That same message comes through in today's first reading. The apostles ask Jesus whether he will be restoring the kingdom to Israel, and he is clear in his answer: "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority." And then, after saying this, he ascends to the Father. Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus has left his disciples again. But instead of leaving them to weep and mourn - as happened after his death - this time, our Lord left them with a mission. They were to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." They did, faithfully, and they traveled far and wide. Armed with the gift of the Holy Spirit which they received at Pentecost, they baptized countless people as they shared the Good News about Jesus and his gift of salvation.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

After Jesus gives the disciples the command to go out and preach the Gospel, he says that "whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." He offers salvation for those who believe in him. And he says that the disciples, and us, will be his witnesses in the world. Sacred tradition tells us that Andrew and Philip preached in Asia Minor while Bartholomew and Thomas spent time in India. Others are said to have gone to Palestine, Persia, and Ethiopia. All died a martyr's death - except John who had been entrusted with the care of our Blessed Mother. We are his witnesses today, and we are also commissioned to go into the world and proclaim the Gospel. Today, as we celebrate his ascension into heaven, let us allow ourselves a moment to gaze upward and behold Jesus' power and glory. Let the Ascension renew our commitment to do the work he has asked us to do, and remind us of his presence here with us in all that we do.

PRAY We know the mission Jesus has given us and we know we have the Holy Spirit to help us carry it out. For prayer this week, meditate on Paul's words to the Ephesians and ask the Lord for "a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of [our] hearts be enlightened, that [we] may know what is the hope that belongs to his call."

Valuing Life, No Matter Where You Live



Recently, on April 17, 2024, I traveled to the second annual "March for Life" in Springfield, Illinois. The morning began as over 1,500 people gathered for Mass at University of Illinois' Sangamon Auditorium in Springfield. We started the day fittingly through, with and in Christ, to be strengthened and nourished by the Word and Sacrament, the real and true Bread of Life. Among this large crowd, I concelebrated Mass on the stage with many bishops, priests, deacons, and seminarians from all six dioceses in the state of Illinois. I had the honor and privilege to deliver the homily.

As I preached, I could not help but notice the youthful spirit of the assembly. It was encouraging to see so many young Catholics present to celebrate, promote, and pray for the gift of life. Those who are my age and older were heartened and reassured to witness the baton of this important pro-life ministry being passed on to and embraced by the next generation.

In my homily, I began by asking everyone to raise their hands according to the diocese they lived in. It was uplifting to see representation from all six dioceses, including Belleville, Chicago, Joliet, Peoria, Rockford, and Springfield. After that quick survey, I inquisitively asked, "Do those of you who live in one diocese have more value than those who live in another?" They instantaneously responded, "No!" I affirmed their response and added, "You are right! Those of you who live in one diocese do not have more value than those who live in another diocese."

And here is my point: One's value should not depend on where one lives! Likewise, one's value should not depend on whether one lives inside the womb or outside of the womb.

Too many people support a culture that claims that human life only has value once he or she is living outside of the womb. However, in the Catholic Church, we support a counter-cultural point of view. Namely, we value life from conception to natural death. God is the creator and author of life, and life itself is a gift from God. Therefore, we respect, support, pray, promote, and value life both inside and outside of the womb.

There are people who would prefer we not gather at events like the March for Life with our prayers, our voices, and our advocacy. Yet Pope Francis has stated, "I urge civil authorities to be especially attentive to children who are denied their fundamental rights and dignity, particularly their right to life." And that is exactly what happened on April 17th in Springfield: together we urged civil authorities to be especially attentive to children who are denied their fundamental rights and dignity, particularly the right to life.

Let me extend a word of gratitude to those of you who support the gift of life through your prayers. Thank you, too, to those of you who put your faith into action through your donations, support, advocacy, and care to assist with those choosing life for the unborn child, especially in crisis situations. We are grateful to those involved with ministries of accompaniment, by supporting post-abortive women and men, through counseling, retreats, and compassionate support groups.

The month of May is often associated with the arrival of Spring and the renewal of life. During this time, we also turn to Mary in a special way, celebrating her "YES" in bringing forth new life through Jesus Christ. Through her Son's life, suffering, death, and resurrection, we have been given the gift of life eternal. We acknowledge one's value should not depend on where one lives, because life is a gift from God both inside the womb and outside of the womb. And with Easter joy, we continue to celebrate that eternal-life is a gift from God for those who believe and follow our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Our Lady of Mercy, Life-Giving Spring, pray for us. And let us celebrate our mothers - those on this earth and those in heaven - with prayers of love and gratitude this Mother's Day.

No mattresses, TVs old computers or monitors will be accepted.

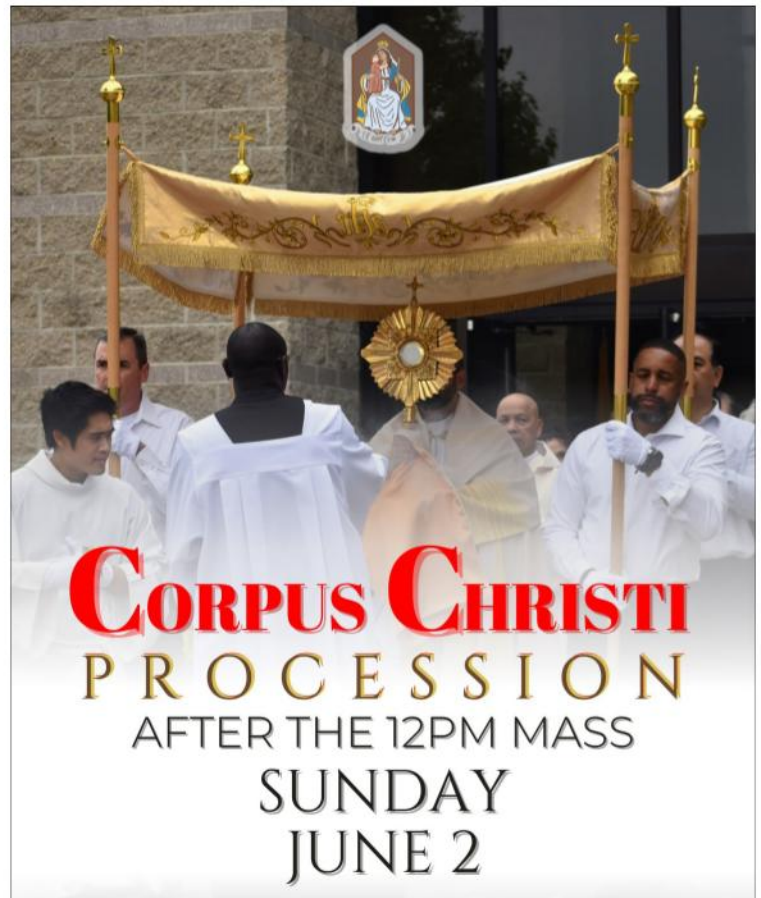

For the Budget Year 2023/24 we have Increased the Parish Sunday goal by 1.3%, to \$31,000/week, to help expand our numerous varied Ministries.

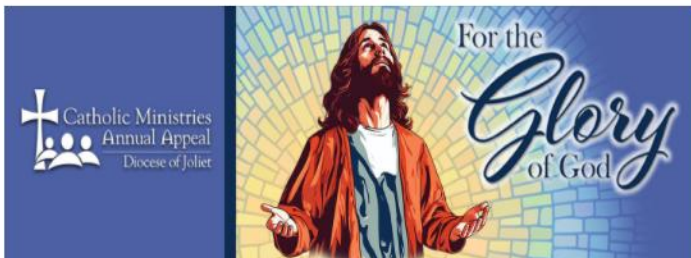

The bride, groom or either set of parents must be registered members of the parish for at least six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Weddings may be scheduled no less than six months out in order to fulfill the diocesan marriage preparation requirements. Contact Theresa Simeo at 331-707-5374.
