News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



In every Mass there are entrance and exit processions with priest, deacons, and servers! Have you ever wondered why? What does this simple gesture of walking in and out of Mass mean? The reason is simple: in this world, we are on a journey. It can be clearly seen in our daily lives. We are constantly on the go, going between point A and point B. This is seen in our careers, our vo-

cations, but more importantly in our spiritual lives. We are on a journey from this world to the next!

However, like any journey, our spiritual life is filled with many obstacles, crosses, and trials. And if it isn't apparent to you by now, let me be the first to tell you: the spiritual journey was never meant to be traveled alone, nor are we un-equipped to make that journey!

This Sunday we celebrate Corpus Christi – the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. It is an old tradition of the Church to have a longer procession with the Eucharist after Mass, which we will do on the parish grounds after the noon Mass. Some churches will carry the Eucharist throughout their entire town. What does this symbolize? Why go out into the world with the Eucharist in a Monstrance (that gold frame in which we carry our Lord)? This procession reveals to those around us, and even to ourselves, that we are on a journey with the Lord; and that our Lord has given us food for that journey. He has equipped us with His Body and Blood, to feed, nourish, and to give us strength for the road ahead.

On this day of Corpus Christi, let us give praise with joy and gratitude to the Lord our God who gives us His very Body and Blood, and who travels with us in our journey of life!

¡En cada Misa hay procesiones de entrada y salida con sacerdote, diáconos y servidores! ¿Te has preguntado alguna vez por qué? ¿Qué significa este simple gesto de entrar y salir de Misa? La razón es simple: en este mundo estamos en un viaje. Se puede ver claramente en nuestra vida diaria. Estamos constantemente en movimiento, yendo entre el punto A y el punto B. Esto se ve en nues-

tras carreras profesionales, nuestras vocaciones, pero más importante aún en nuestra vida espiritual. ¡Estamos en un viaje de este mundo al siguiente!

Sin embargo, como todo viaje, nuestra vida espiritual está llena de muchos obstáculos, cruces y pruebas. Y si a estas alturas no te resulta evidente, déjame ser el primero en decirte: ¡el viaje espiritual nunca fue pensado para ser recorrido solo, ni estamos preparados para realizarlo!

Este domingo celebramos el Corpus Christi — la Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Es una antigua tradición de la Iglesia tener una procesión más larga con la Eucaristía después de la Misa, lo cual haremos en los terrenos parroquiales después de la Misa del mediodía. Algunas iglesias llevarán la Eucaristía por toda la ciudad. ¿Qué simboliza esto? ¿Por qué salir al mundo con la Eucaristía en la Custodia (ese marco de oro en el que llevamos a nuestro Señor)? ¡En este día de Corpus Christi, alabemos con alegría y gratitud al Señor nuestro Dios que nos da Su mismo Cuerpo y Sangre, y que viaja con nosotros en nuestro camino de vida!

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Corpus Christi

Ex 24:3-8 | Heb 9:11-15 | Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The Feast of Corpus Christi celebrates the great Christian mystery of the Eucharist - that Jesus Christ is really, truly, and substantially present under the appearances of bread and wine. At the Last Supper, Jesus breaks the bread and passes the cup of wine, telling his disciples to take, and eat, this is his body and blood. In the Old Testament, as we saw in the first reading, blood was seen as both a sacrifice and a covenant, a promise between God and his chosen people. Jesus says he is the new covenant, and instructs his disciples to do as he has done, in memory of him. The layers to what Jesus is saying are many: He is the new promise between God and people; he will be the sacrifice; and yet he will remain with them when they partake in the Eucharist. The salvation of all people is wrapped up in this seemingly simple act of eating bread and drinking wine because Jesus transcends time, just as he transcended death, to be truly present to us in the sacrament. What a profound and beautiful act of love! One we can barely begin to understand with our human minds. The first disciples likely didn't understand it either, at least not at first. But with time, and with the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, they came to see just how transformative that Passover meal was.

GO EVANGELIZE


PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Our faith contains many great mysteries that challenge our modern sensibilities. After all, we live in a time where many think there ought to be no mysteries. Need an answer? Look it up online! But no matter how much knowledge we have, God's ways are still a mystery to us. Why did Jesus have to die? Why can't he return now? How do we know he's really present in the Eucharist? Rather than shying away from the mysteries of faith, perhaps we should try to become more comfortable with the unknowable and be willing to talk about it. After all, we may not understand exactly how the sun works, but we can feel its warmth. We can't prove the love of a parent or a friend, but we know it's there. God's love, and the mysteries of the Eucharist, can be felt and experienced, and can change our lives.

PRAY Today the Church sings what is called a "sequence," a hymn sung after the second reading but before the Gospel acclamation. There are only four days in the liturgical year that include a sequence, and today's hymn was composed in 1274 by St. Thomas Aquinas: *Lauda Sion*, or, "Praise the Savior oh Zion." Spend some time this week with the words of this hymn, either in prayerful reading or perhaps listening to a sung version.
